





STED BUTTERNUT SQUASH SOUP

There's no better way to begin a meal on a chilly evening than with a bowl of velvety butternut squash soup.

The secret lies in roasting the squash first. Instead of simply boiling it, roasting concentrates the flavour and brings out its natural sweetness with a hint of caramelisation. Cut the squash into even chunks, toss them with olive oil, a sprinkle of salt, and cracked black pepper, and spread them out on a baking tray. Roast in a hot oven until the edges begin to turn golden and slightly crisp - that's when you know the flavour is at its best.

While the squash works its magic in the oven, gently sauté a chopped onion and a clove of garlic in a large pan with a little butter or oil. Keep the heat low and steady so they soften and turn sweet without burning. Once the squash is ready, add it to the pan, then pour in enough vegetable stock to cover everything. Bring the mixture to a gentle simmer and let it bubble away for about 10 minutes to meld the flavours together.

The final step is to blend until silky smooth. A hand blender works perfectly, or you

can transfer the soup to a jug blender in batches. Taste for seasoning, then swirl in a dash of cream or coconut milk for richness. Garnish with fresh herbs or toasted pumpkin seeds for a little crunch. Served with crusty bread for dipping, this soup is simple, nourishing, and feels like a hug in a bowl.

WARM CHOCOLATE FONDAN

Few puddings feel as indulgent - or as comforting - as a warm chocolate fondant. Crisp on the outside and meltingly soft in the middle, it's the perfect way to end a cosy evening. And the best part? It's easier to make than you might think.

Start by preheating your oven to 200°C (180°C fan) and preparing four ramekins. A little butter and a dusting of cocoa powder will stop the puddings from sticking and give them that professional finish when they're turned out.

Meanwhile, melt together dark chocolate and butter in a bowl set over gently simmering water. Stir until smooth, then set aside to cool slightly - this helps the mixture blend beautifully when combined with the eggs. Speaking of which, whisk your eggs, extra yolks, and sugar until pale, thick, and airy. This stage



then sift over a little flour. Fold once more until just combined, gives the fondants their lightness. taking care not to knock out too Next, gently fold the cooled much air. Divide the glossy batter look set, but don't be tempted



have drunk it!







HOOKED FOR LIFE AT FOXHILL FISHE



FISHERFOLK!

Angling is recognised as one of the most popular participant sports across the UK and Pembrokeshire is no exception.

With an amazing number of anglers who enjoy trying to pit their wits against fish of all varieties from sharks off boats to kids who love to catch sticklebacks in small streams before moving on to more sophisticated forms that include fly fishing as one of the main disciplines in rivers or in fisheries across our county, who offer peace and tranquility alongside testing their wits against those of a range of species.

'HOOKED' AT A **VERY YOUNG AGE**

There is no finer example of this than the recently-opened Foxhill Fishery, just outside Camrose, established in style by Steve Evans, who hails from farming stock in Spittal and who first savoured the joy of using a rod and line by going down to Spittal Brook with his grandfather Ivor on quiet days on the family farm and trying to catch brown

"From there it was on to the hunt for sewin on the Western Cleddau at St Catherine and Treffgarne Bridges," Steve told us, "and we couldn't wait for darkness to come because we might catch half a dozen in the pitch-black night - but we always had the unwritten rule that we would only take two home to enjoy eating the next day, so we were already converted to preserving the then-plentiful wildlife, with birds aplenty that stock in the river.



NOW LIVING A LIFELONG DREAM

Steve readily admits that he was literally 'hooked' from the start and now, almost 40 years later, he has achieved his dream by moving out of farming and recently opening his own Fishery at Foxhill, near Camrose.

And what an amazing place it is because his pond is spread over three acres and has 14 'pegs' from which those who are flocking there can try and catch the amazing number of almost 2,500 trout that are in the pond, rising in weight from three-pounders to monsters of 22 pounds!

They are superb specimens of rainbow, brown and blue trout, plus Spartic trout, which are a hybrid form of brook trout and Arctic char, which Steve assures us are not only hard to catch but put up an amazing fight that will test even the most experienced

OTIVE TRENDS TO WATCH FOR 2025

the midst of a transformative shift, with 2025 set to be a landmark year for innovation and sustainability. As technology continues to evolve at a remarkable pace, manufacturers and technology giants alike are redefining what's possible on our roads. From the ongoing rise of electric and autonomous vehicles to major advancements in artificial intelligence (AI), connectivity, and environmental stewardship, the future of transport is fast approaching.

ELECTRIFICATION

The move towards emissionsfree personal transport relies heavily on the electrification of drivetrains. A crucial driver of this change is the need to reduce local pollutants modern electric vehicles (EVs) produce significantly lower emissions, dust, and noise than their petrol or diesel counterparts. Moreover, the global push for sustainability means that truly emissions-free mobility will require EVs to be powered by renewable energy sources, enabling fully carbon-neutral transport.

AUTONOMOUS DRIVING

Forecasts suggest that the rollout of self-driving passenger vehicles on UK roads could save an additional 3,200 lives and prevent 53,000 serious accidents by 2040 generating an estimated £38 billion boost to the UK economy. Public attitudes are also shifting, with 29% of adults in the UK already open to using automated passenger services. Among Generation Z, interest is even stronger, with 44% indicating willingness to embrace this technology.

CONNECTIVITY

The global connected car market, currently valued at around \$103.24 billion, is projected to grow to \$191.83 billion by 2028.
